

Singular and Plural Nouns

Aunt Phoebe folds a cloth.

Aunt Phoebe folds two cloths.

The color is beautiful.

The colors are beautiful.

- A **singular noun** names one person, place, or thing.
- A **plural noun** names more than one person, place, or thing.
- To form most plural nouns, add *-s* to the singular noun.
- If a singular noun ends with *s*, *x*, *ch*, or *sh*, form the plural by adding *-es* to the singular noun.

Singular and Plural Nouns	
How to form plural nouns	Examples
For most nouns, add <i>-s</i> to the singular form.	carpet/carpets symbol/symbols house/houses place/places cloth/cloths square/squares
For nouns ending in <i>s</i> , <i>x</i> , <i>ch</i> , or <i>sh</i> , add <i>-es</i> to the singular form.	dress/dresses box/boxes patch/patches wish/wishes
