John bought popcorn and a drink. How much did he spend for his snack?

John went to the 2:00 P.M. movie.

2

A drink costs \$1.50.

3

Five tickets cost \$30.00.

4

Popcorn costs \$2.50.

B

It takes 3 cups of flour to make 1 cake. How much milk is used to make the cake?

1

A quart of milk contains 32 ounces.

2

2 tablespoons of vanilla are needed for 1 cake.

3

The recipe for 1 cake calls for 1 cup of milk.

4

3 cakes are being made.

C

It takes Mary 1 hour to walk 3 miles. John walks for 45 minutes. What is the difference in the times that they walked?

1

John and Mary each walked 3 miles.

2

John and Mary live 20 miles apart.

3

John takes 45 minutes to walk 3 miles.

4

John and Mary rested for 1 hour after they walked.

D

Susan drove her car from Houston to Los Angeles. How much did she pay for gasoline?

1

Susan's car uses 1 gallon to go 30 miles.

2

Susan took 3 people with her.

3

Gasoline costs \$3.00 for 1 gallon.

4

The distance from Houston to Los Angeles is 1,500 miles.

E

Bill bought 3 times as many bananas as Tom. How much did Bill pay for the bananas?

1

Bananas cost 50¢ for each pound.

2

Tom bought 12 apples and 6 potatoes.

3

Tom bought 3 bananas.

4

3 bananas cost 60¢.

F

Ann bought 3 chairs for \$20 each. She sold some to Bill. How much did Bill pay for each chair?

1

Ann paid \$30 for each of two tables.

2

Ann sold Tom 2 lamps for \$50 each.

3

Ann sold Bill 2 chairs.

4

Ann sold each chair to Bill for \$4 more than she paid for it.
