

More Plural Nouns

- A **singular noun** names one person, place, or thing.
- A **plural noun** names more than one person, place, or thing.

Singular and Plural Nouns

How to Form Noun Plurals	Examples
For nouns ending with a consonant + <i>y</i> , change the <i>y</i> to <i>i</i> and add <i>-es</i> .	supply/ supplies city/cities sky/skies
For special nouns, learn the special plural forms.	man/men child/children tooth/teeth
For some nouns, the plural form is the same as the singular form.	deer/deer sheep/sheep bison/bison
